## Calvin Grant Capson August 14, 1942 ~ June 5, 2017

Calvin Grant Capson passed from this earth on Monday, June 5, 2017 at his home in Columbia City, Oregon after a battle with heart disease. His loving wife Judy was by his side.

Calvin was the fourth of ten children born to Delbert Carl and Lucille Grantham Capson. He was born in Ely, Nevada on August 14, 1942. The family moved to Moreland, Idaho in 1948. Calvin attended Moreland and Riverside schools, graduating from Snake River High School in 1960.

He was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. Calvin married Sharon Brown and they had three daughters, Connie, Shari and Julie. They later divorced, and he married Irma Jewel Mizer (Judy). Judy brought three children to the union, Joline, Janet and Bob.

Calvin was always a hard worker and was employed by local farmers all through high school. Calvin made a career working for Albertsons as a Regional Produce Manager. He traveled and lived throughout the western United States, eventually choosing to retire in Columbia City, Oregon. Calvin loved the mountains and spoke often of his hunting trips with his dad and brothers.

The Annual Capson Reunion in Sawmill Canyon was a favorite time for Calvin. He would drive from Oregon to spend time riding 4-wheelers, telling tales, playing games, and enjoying family. Calvin was an avid reader and remembered everything he read. He would always enlighten friends and family with stories from the latest books he had read. He read mostly history, and was especially intrigued by the World Wars. Calvin and Judy traveled to Idaho for Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays often, and a highlight of every visit was the wonderful salmon he would bring for everyone to enjoy.

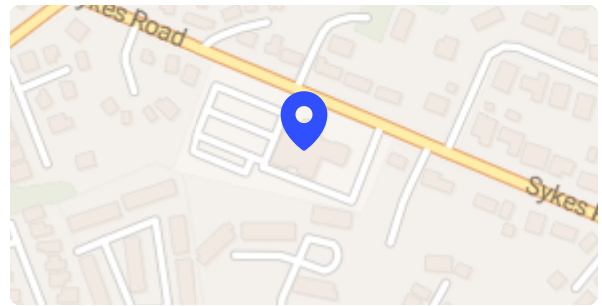
