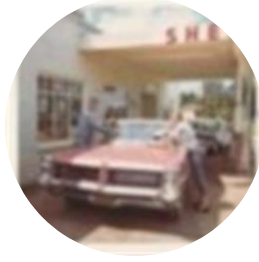

She died on February 17, 2004 at a Portland hospital at the age of 82.
