Betty Harrington passed away in St. Helens on September 14, 2012. She was 89 years of age.

Betty was born on June 6th, 1923 in Kalispell, Montana, the 5th of 6 children born to George and Blanche Radabah Sievers. Raised in Kalispell the family moved to St. Helens in 1939 when Betty was about 16 years old.
